STATE REP. JOE HAMM: *SECURING FUNDING FOR LOCAL PROJECTS*

LYCOMING CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY CENTER

I helped LycoCTC receive two transformative state grants in the amount of \$5 million and \$1 million for their critical expansion project that will strengthen workforce training opportunities across Lycoming County. The funding will directly support construction, equipment, and classroom outfitting for the LycoCTC expansion project. This \$6 million investment represents a major step forward in ensuring our students have access to high-quality, hands-on training that leads directly to family-sustaining careers.

SONESTOWN SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

I assisted Sullivan County with securing a \$777,500 grant through the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program for the Sonestown Sewer System Improvements Phase II Project. The project will upgrade both the collection system and wastewater treatment plant to reduce ongoing issues and improve reliability. These improvements will help improve flow, reduce system failures, and prevent future overflows and backups of the Sonestown Sewer System.

MUNCY BOROUGH

I worked with Muncy Borough to obtain \$500,000 from the Local Share Account (LSA) – Statewide grant program for their Municipal Building Construction Project. This project involves the construction of a 4,800-square-foot building to include offices, ADA restrooms, a break room, public meeting room, and a separate space for existing road maintenance equipment with a lift and garage bay. These improvements will eliminate two buildings currently within the floodplain that lack appropriate ADA accessibility for public meetings and consolidate borough operations into one modern building.

FIGHTING FOR RELIABLE AND AFFORDABLE ENERGY

We are all feeling the pressure from the current energy crisis, which has driven up our electric bills. As your State Representative, I will always fight to keep energy costs affordable for Pennsylvanians. I serve on the House Energy Committee. The Republican members of the Energy Committee are always looking for ways to expand responsible energy production here in the Commonwealth and oppose burdensome regulations that inflate the cost of energy to consumers and reduce its reliability. There is no reason why we should pay exorbitant electricity prices when our nation has an abundance of generation sources like natural gas, coal, and nuclear, which make up over 85% of all energy sources.

I continue to fight for additional base load energy to help drive electricity prices down and to keep Pennsylvania from experiencing brownouts and blackouts. I will also continue to strongly oppose all the Governor's energy plans that would implement a carbon tax, which would increase electricity prices by an additional 40%. It is time to significantly increase energy production to meet the demands of today.



ANOTHER BUDGET THAT IS OUT OF TOUCH WITH PENNSYLVANIANS JUST TRYING TO MAKE ENDS MEET

Before I ever take a vote, I ask myself one simple question – does this benefit the hard-working people of Lycoming and Sullivan counties and our rural region? Farmers, seniors, small business owners and all Pennsylvanians don't have the luxury of spending more than they bring in and certainly not deferring payment of their bills. The approved 2026-2027 budget spends billions more than the state will receive in revenue and defers Medicaid payments of over \$2.64 Billion. In total the budget spends \$50.8 Billion and with the \$2.64 Billion in Medicaid balloons to nearly \$53.44 Billion. Politicians will tell you it is a \$50.8 Billion budget, but they will conveniently leave out the deferred Medicaid payments, one-time special fund transfers, and the one-time gimmicks and shell games included in this budget. As a Citizen Legislator, I'll always tell you the truth of what happens behind closed doors in our State Capitol.

I continue my call for the Governor and General Assembly to focus on cutting costs like eliminating waste, fraud and abuse from our Human Services programs. There

are common-sense reforms that would save taxpayers billions by preventing benefits from being accessed by those who try to cheat the system and take away from those who truly need help. I will continue to put Pennsylvania taxpayers first by fighting to get our recurring structural deficit under control rather than kicking the can down the road year after year.

Despite voting against the annual state spending plan due to it being out of touch with hard-working Pennsylvanians, I believe there were several positives included in it. We were able to eliminate more than \$1 Billion from Gov. Josh Shapiro's initial proposal. Additionally, this budget preserves the Rainy Day Fund for a time when Pennsylvania will truly need it. It included an additional \$775 Million for rural roadways and bridges. Republicans were also successful in adding \$10 Million for Career and Technical Education and stopping Gov. Shapiro's attack on the highly successful Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. Our work saved school choice scholarships for thousands of Pennsylvania students.

I attended the Jersey Shore Lions Club meeting held at the Jersey Shore Elks Club to celebrate their 75th anniversary. Jersey Shore Lions Club raises money to donate to community organizations like our local Volunteer Fire Companies, North Central Sight Services, Camp Victory, Jersey Shore Library, Geisinger Jersey Shore Hospital, and Jersey Shore National Night Out. I presented the Jersey Shore Lions Club with a Citation from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives to honor them for 75 years of dedicated service to our community.



It was my pleasure to help Son Light House volunteers unload a delivery of healthy food in preparation for the Easter holiday food distribution. Food insecurity continues to be a significant problem in our area. We are blessed to have facilities like Son Light House in Muncy and their volunteers to help meet the needs of our communities.



I served as a panelist to interview Montoursville Future Farmers of America (FFA) students seeking officer positions in the club. The students were required to submit applications explaining why they are qualified to serve and what they would do if selected to serve as an officer. The officer candidates talked about raising awareness for agriculture, increasing club membership, and doing more community service projects. It was clear that the Montoursville FFA students have a deep passion for agriculture and community. I will always support FFA and Agriculture Programs in our schools. Our area has a rich agricultural history, and it is programs like these that will continue to raise up our next generation of farmers.
